5. Ontario Public School Boards' Association (OPSBA) Report

Trustee Chase reported on the Board of Directors meetings that took place on December 2 and 3, 2016.

- OPSBA has created a discussion paper on EQAO and large sale testing in Ontario based on feedback received from schools.
- OPSBA is in the process of creating a brief for the 2017/18 Grants for Student's Needs based on feedback from school boards. If Trustees would like to provide feedback, they can forward it to Trustee Chase.
- By the beginning of September 2017, school boards will be required to ensure the provision of before and after school programs for 6-12 year olds where there is sufficient demand.
- An Education Conference was hosted by the Ministry of Education on November 9 and 10, 2016. Slides from presentations during the conference will be posted on the OPSBA website.
- The Ministry of Education has established a French as a Second Language working group which met for the first time on November 16, 2016.
- Registration is now open for the Public Education Symposium which will be held from January 19-21, 2017.
- The Labour Relations Symposium will be held from April 6-7, 2017.
- The Canadian School Boards Association Conference will be held from July 5-8, 2017.
