i. <u>Welcome Back to Students and Staff</u>

Excitement was in the air on September 6, 2016 as DSBN students and families arrived at school, full of smiles and energy. Teachers, administrators and support staff also featured wide grins as they warmly welcomed new and returning students. Director Hoshizaki thanked everyone at the DSBN, from teachers and administrators, to support staff, senior leaders and Trustees, for their commitment and dedication to student success.

ii. Great Start Up to the New School Year

The old saying that "you never get a second chance to make a first impression" holds true and John Brant Public School did not disappoint. There was a great deal of excitement and anticipation in the school yard as students and families eagerly awaited the doors to open for the very first time.

The DSBN's newest school in Ridgeway is full of opportunities for students. It is a school that everyone: students, staff, trustees, parents and the community, can be extremely proud of. One community member stated, "To say I was pleasantly surprised is an understatement. The new school is the talk of Ridgeway. It is new, but has a design that presents an historical context...You have done a fantastic job."

iii. <u>I Matter</u>

There has been tremendous feedback on the launch of DSBN's newly developed Strategic Plan and the I Matter campaign.

DSBN strives to show every individual involved with its system how they matter: as individuals, as learners and as community members. It will be very exciting to see I Matter come to life in schools, departments and communities across the DSBN.

iv. <u>Welcome Centre</u>

There has been an excellent start to the 2016-17 school year with many new families making their way to the DSBN Welcome Centre.

167 new students have been welcomed to the DSBN including 90 elementary students and 77 secondary students.

Director Hoshizaki thanked Stacy Turner and Welcome Centre staff for their excellent work and support of this important service for DSBN newcomer families.

v. International Education

The International Education office welcomed 46 international students from Korea and 16 from China to participate in a two week summer camp at the DSBN over the period of July 18-28, 2016. The Korean program involved students from Grades 3-12 and was held at A.N. Myer Secondary School while the Chinese program involved all Grade 10 students and was held at Sir Winston Churchill Secondary School.

This international summer camp program provided DSBN staff and students the opportunity to learn about other cultures and provided the international students with the opportunity to explore the beauty of the Niagara Region and DSBN schools in the hopes that some of them will return for full-year academics.

vi. DSBN Students Take Gold!

Grace Tennant and Trinity Tuttie both returned from the National Youth Legion Track and Field Championships in Quebec this past August with medals in hand.

Grace, a student at South Lincoln High School dominated the 1-kilogram discus throw by setting a new meet record with a distance of 46.14 meters, while also earning a bronze medal in the 400g javelin throw.

Trinity, an Eastdale Secondary School student, also set a new meet record in the 3kg shot put with a distance of 15.87 meters and placed second in the youth discus throw.

Earlier in the summer, while competing at OFSAA, Grace won gold for discus and shot put in her division, while Trinity took gold in her division for shot put.

Director Hoshizaki noted that Welland Centennial Secondary School student, Sheldon Davis cycled over 7,000 km in 70 days this summer and raised over \$3,000 for a, local charity, the Hope Centre.
