vi. Students Win OFSAA Gold Medals

Congratulations to DSBN students Trinity Tutti and Grace Tennant, who were both triple gold medal winners at OFSAA track and field last week. As well as winning three gold medals in their respective zones, both students set record breaking throws in javelin, shot put and discus. Trinity actually broke the 31 year old record by almost 3 meters in the discus throw. Grace has qualified for shot put and discus with Team Canada for the world youth track and field championship in Columbia and will be participating later this summer.

Chair Barnett commended Rose Colombe for her leadership and role in bringing the merging school communities together at Diamond Trail Public School.

Chair Barnett recognized the positive impact the Levelled Literacy Intervention Program has on students across the Board. On behalf of the Board, Chair Barnett thanked volunteers throughout the Board for the difference they make in the lives of students.

2. Educational Showcases

(a) Save the Monarch – James Morden Public School

Superintendent Roberto introduced the showcase which featured the Grade 2 and 3 students from James Morden Public School and teacher Melissa McKinney-Lepp.

A short video called "Butterfly Inquiry" highlighted "Team Monarch" and the message that they brought to neighboring public schools on June 3.

Students explained the challenges that monarch butterflies face and how we can encourage the restoration of the monarch habitat by creating our own butterfly gardens. The students recognized the TD Friends of the Environment Foundation for making a grant available to purchase milkweed for their butterfly garden. The students also recognized The City of Niagara Falls for providing a bus to transport them to deliver milkweed and support other schools in creating butterfly gardens. Student presented chair Barnett with a milkweed plant.
