#### vi. STEM Wars and STEM Career Fair

DSBN's first ever STEM Wars took place in May with students competing for summer jobs through the Job Gym in the fields of Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). This initiative, funded through an Experiential Learning Opportunities grant, had 40 students in Grades 10 through 12 from 13 of our secondary schools apply for the opportunity to have a summer job in a STEM field.

On May 11th, a group of 16 candidates made excellent presentations on the STEM career field of their choice in front of a judging panel which included 4 Niagara STEM Employers, Job Gym, and DSBN staff.

On May 20th, the 8 successful candidates presented their potential careers alongside Niagara STEM Employers at a STEM Career Fair held at Ridgeway-Crystal Beach High School. Approximately 85 students from 17 of our secondary schools attended this portion of the Career Fair.

Congratulations to the 8 STEM Wars winners who will meet with Job Gym staff to be placed in summer jobs in their chosen career area.

#### 2. <u>Educational Showcases</u>

#### (a) Park Public School "Me to We" Conference

Superintendent Pisek introduced the presentation which showcased Park Public School's recent *Me to We* "Grow the Change" Conference.

Superintendent Pisek added that under the collaborative leadership of Jennifer Daniels and Jen Bassegio, and with full participation by all staff, the school invited over 20 community partners, including Grimsby Secondary School Students, to attend and present how they contribute to the community – both locally and globally. Students in Grades 3-6 participated in these interactive and informative sessions throughout the day. Students in Grades K-2 used their creative talents to make cards, plant and paint flower pots and bake muffins to deliver to "Lincoln Park Senior Center" to celebrate Mother's Day.

Students Connor, Emma, Jakob, Olivia, Jaxen, and Levi shared their reflections on this very exciting event at Park School.

#### (b) E.I. McCulley Public School – Brainspace Project 2015

Superintendent Reimer Friesen introduced the presentation which showcased E.I. McCulley's "Brainspace Project 2015."

Superintendent Reimer Friesen explained that in March, the publishers of Brainspace Magazine offered several DSBN schools the opportunity to engage in a challenge to use information in their exciting interactive magazine, as well as augmented reality technology, to develop a solution to a real life problem. The staff and students of 4 of our elementary schools rose to the challenge, and the team from E.I. McCulley Public School was declared the winner at this year's recent CONNECT Conference. The winning team took home some fabulous prizes including a Kobo e-reader for the school, and refurbished laptops for each student.

# (b) <u>E.I. McCulley Public School – Brainspace Project 2015</u>

Superintendent Reimer Friesen introduced Teachers Sonja Upton and Becci Magistrale, and students Dale, Rodi, Allan, and Sam who spoke about their challenge and exciting solution.

Teachers Sonja Upton and Becci Magistrale explained that the theme of the project was "Augmented Reality: Life in Space Challenge," and the students' challenge was to speculate and solve the challenges of living in space. Teachers assisted the students by providing a list of resource websites, and by refining the students' thinking and reasoning. Ms. Upton commended the students for their creativity and commitment to the project and added that it was an honour to work with the students who took the initiative for their own learning. Ms. Upton and Ms. Magistrale added that the students were also challenged to communicate their learning in a brief article which will be featured in Brainspace Magazine.

Students Dale, Rodi, Allan, and Sam spoke about the challenges and solutions in developing and constructing pods which addressed the question, "How might the environment and our day to day physical needs be affected out in space?," including looking for food, shelter and oxygen on Mars.

The Board viewed a short video of the students discussing their project, "EIM Utopia, The Future is Now."

The students explained for Trustee Lora Campbell that they used internet sites, books, and a video as resources. Trustee Lora Campbell commended the students on their achievement.

Trustee Linda Crouch commended the students on their impressive level of research.

On behalf of the Board, Chair Barnett thanked the students and staff for the presentation.

#### (c) Silver Birch Celebration

Superintendent Dickson introduced the showcase which celebrated the recent Silver Birch Celebration of Literacy Conference where over 600 DSBN elementary students participated.

Superintendent Dickson recognized Teacher-Librarians Cathy Andres, Denise Falk, and Lynne Karagias who were instrumental in organizing the first annual Board-wide Silver Birch Conference in 2006.

#### (c) Silver Birch Celebration

Superintendent Dickson introduced Kim Salierno, Consultant: School Libraries and Educational Resources, K-12, who gave an update and overview of the 2015 Silver Birch Celebration of Literacy Conference held at Club Roma.

Ms. Salierno explained that the conference is the culminating event for Grades 5-6 students who have participated in the Ontario Library Association's Silver Birch Reading Program. The program aims to develop a life-long love of reading in students, promote and encourage Canadian literature, authors, and illustrators, and develop literacy skills. Each year, students are asked to read the nominated works in each category and then vote for the winners of the Silver Birch awards.

Ms. Salierno added that this year's event featured a fun blending of technology and books and included a "Speaker's Corner" style video chat booth for students to talk about their experiences at the Conference and what they've learned. Ms. Salierno commended the students in Sir Winston Churchill Secondary School's Specialist High Skills Major Program – Communications for facilitating the chat booth. New this year was the use of social media to promote the Conference and live tweeting of the events of the day (#dsbnsilverbirch)..

Ms. Salierno presented a video of students participating in the various activities and sharing their experiences at the Conference.

Ms. Salierno thanked authors Jonathan Auxier and Annaleise Carr for their participation at the Conference.

Ms. Salierno explained for Trustee Helga Campbell that students are eligible to attend the Conference by participating in extracurricular Book Clubs at their home school.

On behalf of the Board, Chair Barnett thanked the DSBN teaching staff for putting on a great Conference.
