This is the best time of year and I would like to thank everyone at the DSBN, from teachers and administrators, to support staff, senior leaders and trustees, for their commitment and dedication to student success.

#### Great Start Up to the New School Year

The old saying that "you never get a second chance to make a first impression" holds true and John Brant P.S. did not disappoint!

There was a great deal of excitement and anticipation in the school yard as students and families eagerly awaited the doors to open for the very first time!

The DSBN's newest school in Ridgeway is full of opportunities for our students. It is a school that everyone: students, staff, trustees, parents and the community, can be extremely proud of. One community member stated, "To say I was pleasantly surprised is an understatement. The new school is the talk of Ridgeway. It is new, but has a design that presents an historical context...You have done a fantastic job."

#### Welcome Centre

There has been an excellent start to the 2016-17 school year with many new families making their way to our Welcome Centre.

We have welcomed 160 new students to the DSBN over the summer months! 87 elementary students, 73 secondary students.

Sincere thanks to Stacy Turner and Welcome Centre staff for their excellent work and support of this important service for our newcomer families.

#### **International Education**

The International Education Office welcomed 46 international students from Korea and 16 from China to participate in a two week summer camp at the DSBN over the period of July 18-28. The Korean program involved students from Grades 3-12 and was held at A.N. Myer S.S. while the Chinese program involved all Grade 10 students and was held at Sir Winston Churchill S.S.

Five DSBN teachers acted as the facilitators delivering a variety of curriculum involving ecology, geography, physical activity, leadership skills, ESL, and the arts. 14 DSBN students acted as student ambassadors to the international students, assisted in the classrooms and on full-day excursions around Niagara Falls and Toronto, all while earning their required volunteer community service hours toward their diploma.

This international summer camp program provided DSBN staff and students the opportunity to learn about other cultures and provided the international students with the opportunity to explore the beauty of the Niagara Region and DSBN schools in the hopes that some of them will return for full-year academic studies.



#### **DSBN Students Take Gold!**

Grace Tennant and Trinity Tuttie both returned from the National Youth Legion Track and Field Championships in Quebec this past August with medals in hand.

The pair compete with team GRUNT (Gaining Respect Utilizing Niagara Throwers) and both had an outstanding season.

Grace, a student at South Lincoln H.S. dominated the 1-kilogram discus throw by setting a new meet record with a distance of 46.14 meters, while also earning a bronze medal in the 400g javelin throw.

Trinity, an Eastdale S.S. student, also set a new meet record in the 3kg shot put with a distance of 15.87 meters. She also placed second behind Grace in the youth discus throw.

Earlier in the summer, while competing at OFSAA, Grace won gold for discus and shot put in her division, while Trinity took gold in her division for shot put.

#### **Renaming of E. W. Farr Elementary School**

As you are aware, a number of residents from the Fenwick community in Pelham have expressed their desire to preserve the name of the E. W. Farr Elementary School following the completion of construction to consolidate the Pelham Centre Public School and E.W. Farr as a K-8 facility. While it is recognized that a municipal Council does not have jurisdictional authority over this issue, Pelham Council deemed it worthwhile to lend support to maintaining the historically significant name of E. W. Farr and as such. at their regular meeting of June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2016, Council of the Town of Pelham approved the following resolution:

THAT staff be directed to send a letter to the District School Board of Niagara requesting that the DSBN reconsider the change in the name for the E. W. Farr Elementary School, due to the feedback received from the community and given the historical and heritage significance of Mr. Farr as a local educator in the Village of Fenwick, Town of Pelham; and

THAT the DSBN be invited to make a presentation to Council should they decide to proceed with renaming the school to Wellington Heights to inform how the name E. W. Farr will be recognized within the school.

We trust that the views of the community will be taken into consideration in this matter as part of the DSBN's collaborative accommodation review process which incorporate meaningful community dialogue and input. DSBN
