DSBN students hear from Holocaust survivors

Grade 7 and 8 students from the District School Board of Niagara will be hearing from two Holocaust survivors during the first Holocaust Symposium and Anti-discrimination Day on November 8. This event is one of two DSBN student forums held during Holocaust Education Week, November 1-9. Approximately 100 students and educators from elementary schools across the DSBN will be participating.

In the morning, students will rotate through interactive stations that include: The Role of the Bystander; The Courage to Care: A Contemporary Look at Intolerance; Learning not to Judge: Vignettes of Prejudice; and Lay Down Your Arms: Initiating Change through Music

In the afternoon session, students will have the opportunity to hear the first hand accounts of two survivors as well as engage in a question and answer session.

- **Howard Chandler** born in Poland, he was a prisoner in Starachowice Labour Camp between 1942 - 44, when he was moved to Auschwitz-Birkenau, Buchenwald, and finally Theresienstadt. He came to Canada as a war orphan.
- **Fagey Libman** born in Lithuania, survived the ghetto and concentration camps. As a child Fagey and her mother lived in Kovno ghetto, then were transferred to Studtthof Concentration camp. In Canada Fagey taught as a Kindergarten teacher until her retirement.
