Maple Grove Teacher Receives Annual Norah Morgan Award

Congratulations to Maple Grove Public School teacher Jerome Black, for receiving the 2008 Norah Morgan Memorial Award. Established by Carousel Players, the award celebrates the commitment and achievements of elementary school teachers who have made a strong contribution to the arts in Niagara region schools. This is the third annual presentation of the award in memory of drama education pioneer Norah Morgan.
