SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

TRUSTEE UPDATE

Trustee Lora Campbell reported the following:

- The District School Board of Niagara is very excited about the purchase of 20 acres of land at 4670 Durham Rd. for our new West Niagara Secondary School. This land is owned by a private owner and is currently empty.
- At the January 23rd Board Meeting, Trustees also approved the distribution of \$263,000 International Education income according to agreed upon principles: a) does not represent continuing cost commitments, b) does not replicate expenditures that would normally be provided through Ministry funding, and c) has long-lasting and board wide impact on student success. The projects that will be funded are:
 - \$165,000 to support playgrounds and early learning outdoor spaces;
 - \$60,000 Education Foundation of Niagara scholarships;
 - \$25,000 Support for physical education equipment for synthetic turf regional site;
 - \$13,000 Support for student led Mental Health Symposium Tuesday, May 8, 2018
